2) Section 7.3.8.6

OLD:

...from Portmahomack, os acromiale was observed unilaterally on the right scapula of five adult males (SSP%: 4.9%) from periods 1 (n=1), 2 (n=3) and 4 (n=1) and across most age groups (apart from 46-59).

NEW:

...from Portmahomack, os acromiale was observed unilaterally on the scapulae of five adult males (SSP%: 4.9%) from periods 1 (n=1, **left**), 2 (n=3, **right**) and 4 (n=1, **left**) and across most age groups (apart from 46-59).

3) Section 8.4.8

OLD:

Unilateral os acromiale of the right scapula was observed on five adult males (3.6%) from Portmahomack, with those most affected from the monastic phase.

NEW:

Unilateral os acromiale was observed on the scapulae of five adult males (3.6%) from Portmahomack, with three males from the monastic phase affected on the right scapula, and those from periods 1 and 4 affected on the left scapula.
