Notes to performers:

This piece is for six players playing at five different tempos. The cello plays at $\text{♩}=96$, the flute and bass clarinet at $\text{♩}=108$, piano at $\text{♩}=120$, vibraphone $\text{♩}=132$, and violin at $\text{♩}=144$. These tempos relate to each other in the ratios 8:9:10:11:12, the idea being that at regular points (i.e. every 8 bars for the cello, every 9 bars for flute and bass clarinet, etc.) the players down beats will coincide. These points of coincidence are marked in the score by rehearsal letters A-Y.

So that the relationship between the different tempos can be more clearly seen this score is not in standard score order, instead the parts are ordered so that the fastest tempo is at the top and the slowest tempo is at the bottom. This means that the order of the parts, top to bottom, is: violin, vibraphone, piano, flute, bass clarinet, cello.

Due to the different tempos the individual player's bar numbers do not correlate. Therefore, in rehearsal, it is best to use the rehearsal letters rather than the bar numbers as these all coincide with each other.

So that the players remain correctly in sync, each player must play to a click track listened to over headphones. The Max patch provided will generate these click tracks in the correct alignment as well as providing regular cues to help the players maintain the correct place in the piece. These cues consist of a voice announcing each of the rehearsal letters and also counting the two bars preceding them (i.e. "2 . . . , 1 . . . , F"). Each player will also be given a two bar count in at the start of the piece.

Programme Note:

This piece is for six players playing at five different tempos. The cello plays at 96 bpm, the flute and bass clarinet at 108 bpm, piano at 120 bpm, vibraphone 132 bpm, and violin at 144 bpm, and so that they remain correctly in sync each player has their own click track on headphones. These tempos relate to each other in the ratios 8:9:10:11:12 and were inspired by the composer Henry Cowell's theory of rhythm harmony that he first set out in his book ***New Musical Resources*** (1930). The aim of this piece is to use this technique to explore the concept of rhythmic consonance and dissonance, for example using the complex ratios such as 8:11 to create rhythms with dissonant rhythms, using the regular convergence points between the different tempos to create moments of consonance and unity, finding the the common relation points between the different tempos to create simple consonant pulses, and also using different tempos to create dense textures of Ligeti-like micro-rhythms.
