Sir, Seven years after the EU referendum and two years since Boris Johnson allegedly "settled" the issue, Brexit's loose ends are still haunting us ("<u>Sunak ready to defy DUP</u> <u>over Brexit trade deal</u>", Feb 20). Rishi Sunak will be keen to quote Charles de Gaulle, who said: "To govern is always to choose among disadvantages." This might be tempting but is wrong: given that the EU remains our main trading partner, it makes sense to minimise trade frictions with Brussels. Sunak should ignore the objections of his Brexiteer MPs and wrap up a deal on the Northern Ireland protocol. By doing so he will exhibit strong leadership qualities that will both boost the UK's economic prospects and strengthen his credentials among the electorate.
