## INTRODUCTION

This thesis is concerned with the study of aspects of the very distinct and recognisable artefact which has become known in English as the 'Funerary Cone'. This term is descriptive of the shape of the object; most of them are indeed cone shaped, with a circular base/face averaging between 5-10 centimetres in diameter, tapering to rounded tip. The circular face/base was stamped before firing using a stone or wooden matrix (see Corpus Number 219) which produced a hieroglyphic text in relief. This text seems to be at the heart of the function of the funerary cone and the great majority of these stamps are circular; it is unclear whether the stamps are circular to fit the circular cone ends, or vice-versa. However, there are examples of rectangular stamps on circular cone-ends which might suggest a regularity in producing the text in straight lines of equal length, while retaining the independently necessary circular face.

They average between 15-20 centimetres in length. They are usually roughly made, but are fired to become hard and durable objects. The great majority are solid, but some larger examples are hollow: Stewart (1986, 23) notes that examples in the Petrie Museum of Corpus Numbers 138 & 215 have a hollow interior and rilling lines, suggesting they were coil-built. This reduction in weight might be useful if large numbers of cones were to be carried and, if so, the cone shape would be advantageous compared to a cylindrical shape. However at this point we reach one of the problems concerning funerary cones; what was it about them that was particularly important? Was it the shape of the cone itself and, if so, what does it represent? Was it the stamped face which, for some reason, needed a 'stem' for it to be affixed somewhere? These are the questions that scholars who have taken an interest in funerary cones have tried to answer – an overview of the development of these theories is found in Chapter 1 below.

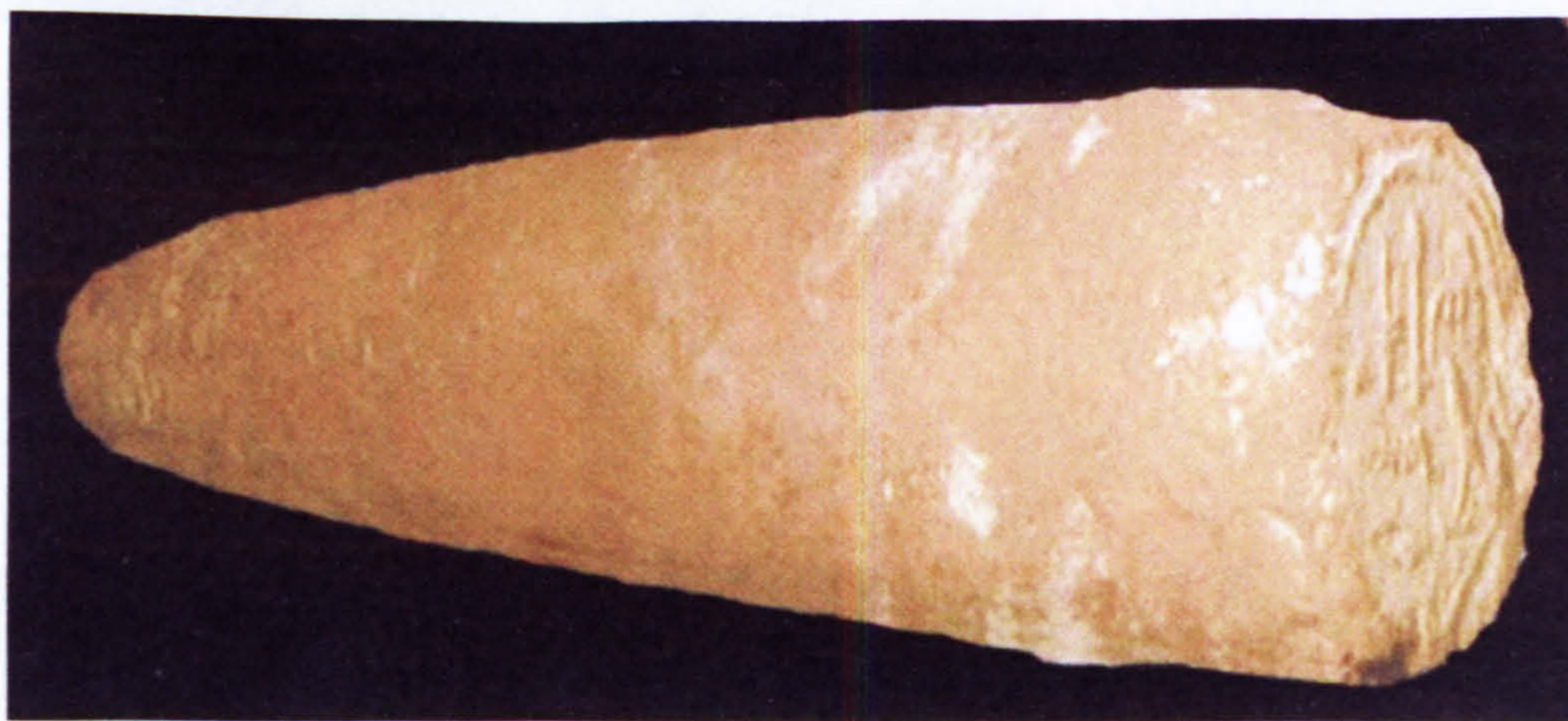


Figure 2: UC.37731 - Cone Corpus 277 (Ryan 2005, 60)

Funerary cones have a limited geographical distribution. Essentially they are a Theban phenomenon, although rare exceptions are known from Aniba, ed-Der and Naga ed-Der, and anepigraphic examples at Rizaqat, Armant, Naqada and Abydos (Eggebrecht 1977, 858; Manniche 1988, 6; and their shared refs. cit.). Manniche argues (1988, 6-7) that although there are examples of cones which mention officials who held offices outside the Theban area, they were buried at Thebes at the end of their careers.

The date range of funerary cones is also limited. They may have their origin in anepigraphic cones of the early Middle Kingdom at Thebes (Eggebrecht 1977, 858), but the vast majority of text-bearing funerary cones date to the period between the beginning of the Eighteenth Dynasty and the reign of Amenhotep III, although the extent of Ramesside use of cones is still debatable, and a few examples occur from the Third Intermediate Period, and with an (archaising? – Eggebrecht 1977, 858) usage in Dynasties 25 and 26.

Some of the funerary cones were partially or wholly painted, some with a white wash covering the entire cone, some blue (Daressy 1893, 270), but most typically with red wash at the circular end (Daressy 1893, 270; Manniche 1988, 4) as though only the protruding circular end of the cone would be visible. It is difficult to find a single explanation for the purpose of funerary cones which would fit this varied series of colourings, and might in itself hint

at a variety of possible uses for cones and would therefore call into doubt any one unifying theory of what funerary cones actually were.

Funerary cones are important sources of information from the texts they contain. These texts primarily refer to the cone-owner by name, by title and by family relationship, although all these attributes are not present on all the cones. They also often contain some reference to funerary expectation particular some Osirian formula. It was obviously very important that their ownership was clearly recognised, although whether that ownership is to do with the cone itself or the structure to which it was attached is not clear.

The aim of this thesis is to contribute to our understanding of funerary cones as multi-attribute artefacts (Ryan 1988) by organising and examining some of those attributes.



## CHAPTER 1

### THE HISTORY OF FUNERARY CONE RESEARCH

Funerary cones only attracted the serious interest of scholars relatively late in the history of Egyptology, perhaps because they were less artistically attractive than many objects found or excavated in Egypt, such as statues or stelae. The first scholar to give an opinion of funerary cones was Mariette (1874, 185-6) who thought they were some form of surface marker indicating the presence of a tomb, although exactly how this would have worked was not explained by him. This idea was largely rejected by later scholars who looked for non-architectural explanations for the cones, such as Maspero (1883, 138) who thought they were model offering bread, or sought architectural explanations which involved the cones being integrated within the rock-cut elite tombs at Thebes (Daressy 1893, 269). With the increase in excavations in the Theban necropolis and the publication of material from the new-significant collections of Egyptian antiquities in European and North American museums more examples of the cones became known, leading to the first attempt to bring together a range of known cone stamps to form a corpus, by Wiedemann (1885).

A particularly large and important collection of funerary cones was compiled at this time by Petrie. While resident in Thebes in 1887 he observed that “their

interest and value are quite equal to that of the shorter funereal stelae...I steadily collected them from the Arabs” (Petrie 1888, 23). Petrie’s focussed interest on the inscribed parts of the cones led him to saw or break the inscribed surface from the bulk of the cone and so “reduced a collection of over 250 to a more manageable bulk” (Petrie 1888, 23). These cones represented 107 different types which were published as hand-copies (Petrie 1888, pls.21-23). Eventually Petrie was to collect over 400 examples of funerary cones, one of the crucial reference collections of cones, now housed in the Petrie Museum at University College, London (Stewart 1986, vii).

As far as the interpretation of the cones was concerned Petrie followed Maspero, remarking that the latter’s explanation that their form and the frequently observed red/white painted wash on their surface represented “the conical loaves of bread with a floury outside, seems obviously true.” (Petrie 1888, 23). Although he also noted that they were always found outside or near the entrance to the tomb he did not link them with any architectural feature, but regarded them as individual models of food-offerings, with the stamped surface being the base of the cones.

#### Daressy’s Recueil de cônes funéraires

In 1893 Daressy published a collection of 304 hand-copies of funerary cones. He noted that these cones were to be found in large numbers in all parts of the Theban necropolis, specifically listed Sheikh Abd el-Qurna, Dra Abu el-Naga

and the Assasif, where they had been “déposés devant l’entrée des tombeaux” (Daressy 1893, 269). To Daressy the explanation that they were architectural features seemed unlikely (he could not see how they might be so employed) as was the theory that they were bread models (Daressy 1893, 269-270). Instead he believed that the cones were deposited by visitors to the tomb as a mark of their visit to the tomb-owner. He explained the large quantities of cones bearing the same stamp found at the same tomb as the result of multiple visits to the tomb by the same individual, each visit being marked by the production and deposition of cones; the matrix-stamps being kept by the guardians of the necropolis from whom cones could be ordered in specific quantities (Daressy 1893, 270).

### Excavations at Thebes 1900’s-1930’s

Increasing work on the West bank at Thebes in the period from the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century to the Second World War inevitably produced more funerary cones. But the discovery of these cones, while adding to the total number of types known, did not always produce much more information regarding their use. Some work was more productive than others, as two examples will demonstrate.

#### 1. French Institute Excavations

Work carried out in the Dra Abu el-Naga by Gauthier and Chassinat in 1906 resulted in the recovery of a considerable quantity (“nombre assez

considerable”) of cones, none of which was found *in situ*, and which were subsequently published (Gauthier 1906; Chassinat 1910). Of these 20 were not found in the Daressy corpus. Gauthier in particular took a very pessimistic view of the contextual value of the collection of funerary cones at Thebes, stating that Dra Abu el-Naga cemetery had been “bouleversée depuis si longtemps et avec un tel acharnement que pas un de ces cones n’a été trouvé en place, dans la position et à l’endroit qu’il devait occuper originairement. Ils étaient dispersés absolument au hasard” (Gauthier 1906, 123) and had therefore little to contribute to an understanding of the role and function of funerary cones and their relationship with tombs in the area (Gauthier 1908, 123) although he stated his belief that the shape of the cones had no intrinsic significance (Gauthier 1908, 124). The recovery of large quantities of cones, as a result of excavation in the Theban necropolis, included the work of Gauthier and his colleagues at the Qurnet Murai between 1916-1918 (Gauthier 1919), but again did little to develop an understanding of the original context or use of these cones.

## 2. Liverpool/Mond Excavations

A different approach to the recovery of funerary cones in the Theban cemeteries was taken in the excavations undertaken in 1925 and 1926 by Robert Mond and Bryan Emery, working for the University of Liverpool in the Sheikh Abd el-Qurna cemetery (Mond & Emery 1927). These excavations were unusual for the time in that they did not simply described the elite tombs

which they 'cleared' (including that of Ramose TT55), but also the process of that clearance in a way that can be recognised as the stratigraphic recording of archaeological contexts and artefacts which would be recognised by modern archaeologists. Their work provides much valuable information as to the context of discovery of funerary cones, rather than simply describing them as "bouleversée".

They recorded the presence of funerary cones, and other related features, as follows:-

**Tomb of Ramose** - Mond and Emery note that close to the doorway of the tomb they discovered "two sandstone pillar plinths" and a "mud brick construction" which they believed were Ramesside (Mond & Emery 1927, 15), and part of an attempt to create a portico construction of the type discussed in the section on Borchardt's work, below. In the in front of the tomb itself they discovered examples of Corpus types 155, 368 and 504. Ramose himself owns a 'matched pair' of cones Corpus 132 & 133. The courtyard in front of the tomb contained six "later" shafts, ranging in depth from 3.8-7.25 metres, each with a small burial chamber at its foot (Mond & Emery 1927, 16-17).

**Tomb of Djehutymes** - 3 burial shafts, one containing cone 589(?)

**Tomb of Amenhotep** -They thought Amenhotep usurped this tomb from its Dynasty 18 owner, Penre "46 of whose funerary cones we recovered from the burial chamber of the tomb" (Mond & Emery 1927, 23). They also noted a

mudbrick construction built before the main entrance . A shaft in court containing cone of Penre (Corpus 524) and in the court itself Corpus 442 (Mond and Emery 1927, 24)

**Neferhotep** - A substantial T-shaped tomb, but no cones found.

**Ineni** - 97 cones of type 480.

**Min-nakht** - 5 cones of type 137 recovered from debris in front of the tomb.

This one season of work in a relatively limited part of the cemeteries at Thebes produced information which suggests a variety of situations regarding the use of funerary cones at Thebes:-

- i. Cones 'belonging' to the tomb found near the tomb either in modest (Min-nakht) or very large (Ineni) numbers.
- ii. Cones both 'belonging' and not 'belonging' to a tomb both found in association with that tomb (Amenhotep/Penre).
- iii. Tombs of significant size, including a wide façade, but seemingly without cones (Neferhotep).
- iv. Tombs which have cones 'belonging' to them, but also cones which do not 'belong' to them and which also have multiple burial shafts and evidence of later architectural additions which might have provided a context for these later cones (Ramose).

The issues raised by the Mond and Emery excavations form the basis of further discussion of the role of funerary cones, especially their varying chronological usage, and their architectural positioning.

Borchardt and the *Friesziegel*

In 1934 Borchardt, with Königsberger and Ricke, published an important article concerning the architectural use of funerary cones (Borchardt et al, 1934). Their argument was that stamps similar to those used on funerary cones (including circular stamps) were also to be found on bricks, especially wedge-shaped bricks, which had a clearly architectural function. This function was most likely to be found in the construction of elaborate mud-brick superstructures which improved and expanded on the facades of elite New Kingdom tombs at Thebes. They further argued that even the cones themselves could be used in this way. They had a number of pieces of evidence which led them to this conclusion. The first was an observation by Rhind who had apparently seen a tomb at Thebes (possibly that of Userhat TT47 – Porter & Moss 1960, 87, but see the note of caution in Manniche 1988, 199, n.8) and had noted that “imbedded in the building, and stretching very nearly its entire length, were two rows of clay cones impressed with a hieroglyphic subject on ends turned to the light” (Rhind 1862, 136-8). A similar, and similarly vague, observation had been made even earlier by Hay who mentioned that cones collected by him (now in Boston) included some “arranged over the door of a Tomb, found by me at Thebes” (Reeves & Ryan 1987) noting Rhind’s observation of this phenomenon (Borchardt et al, 1934, 25). The second piece of evidence was the discovery by Winlock (1928) of an 11<sup>th</sup> Dynasty tomb whose façade was decorated with rows of uninscribed funerary cones. Although these cones were different in date and in not being

inscribed from those of the New Kingdom, their use in this way suggested that in the New Kingdom too they could have been displayed in such a way. (Borchardt et al, 1934, 34-35).

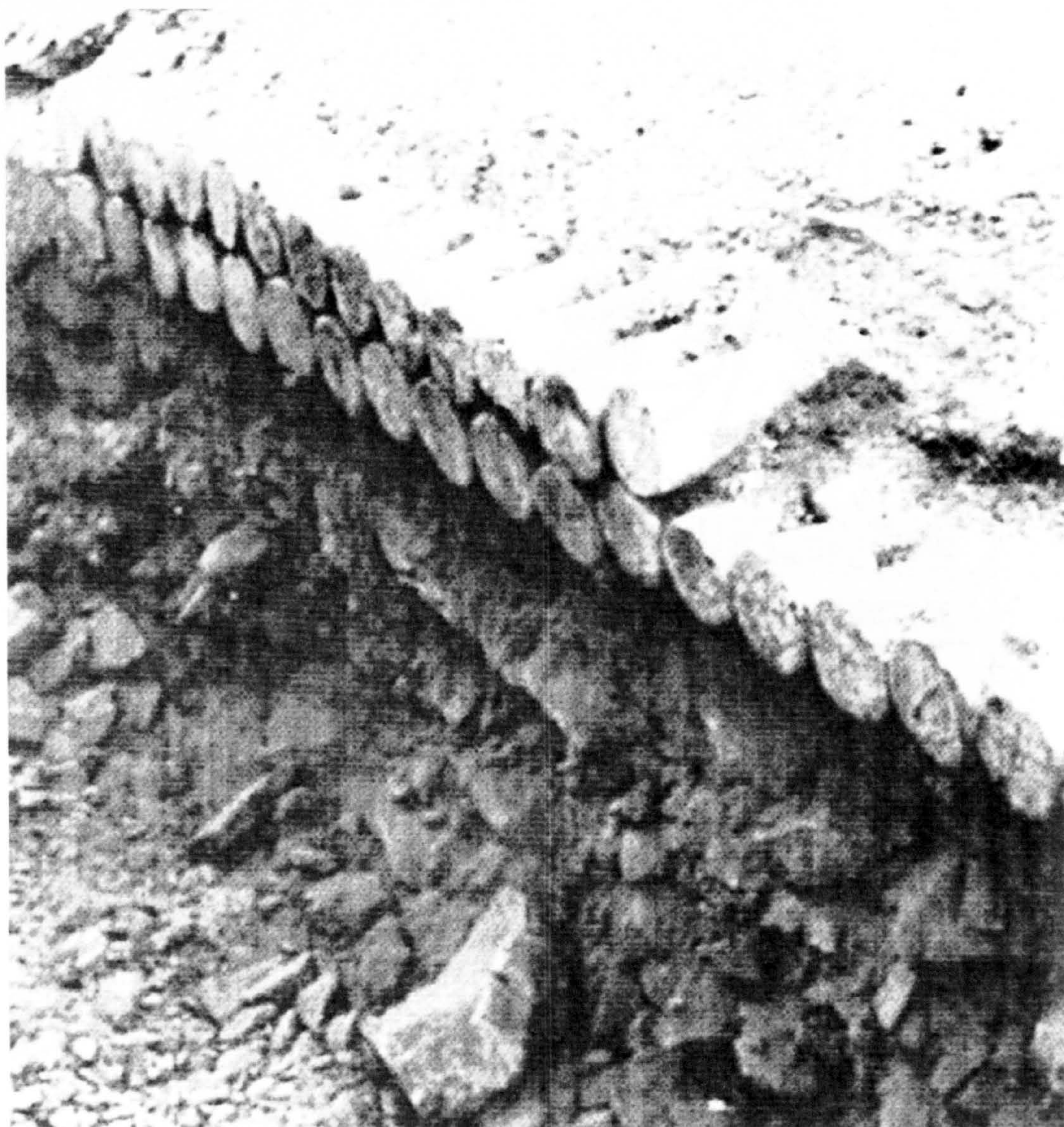


Figure 3: Middle Kingdom cones at Thebes (Winlock 1928, fig.4)

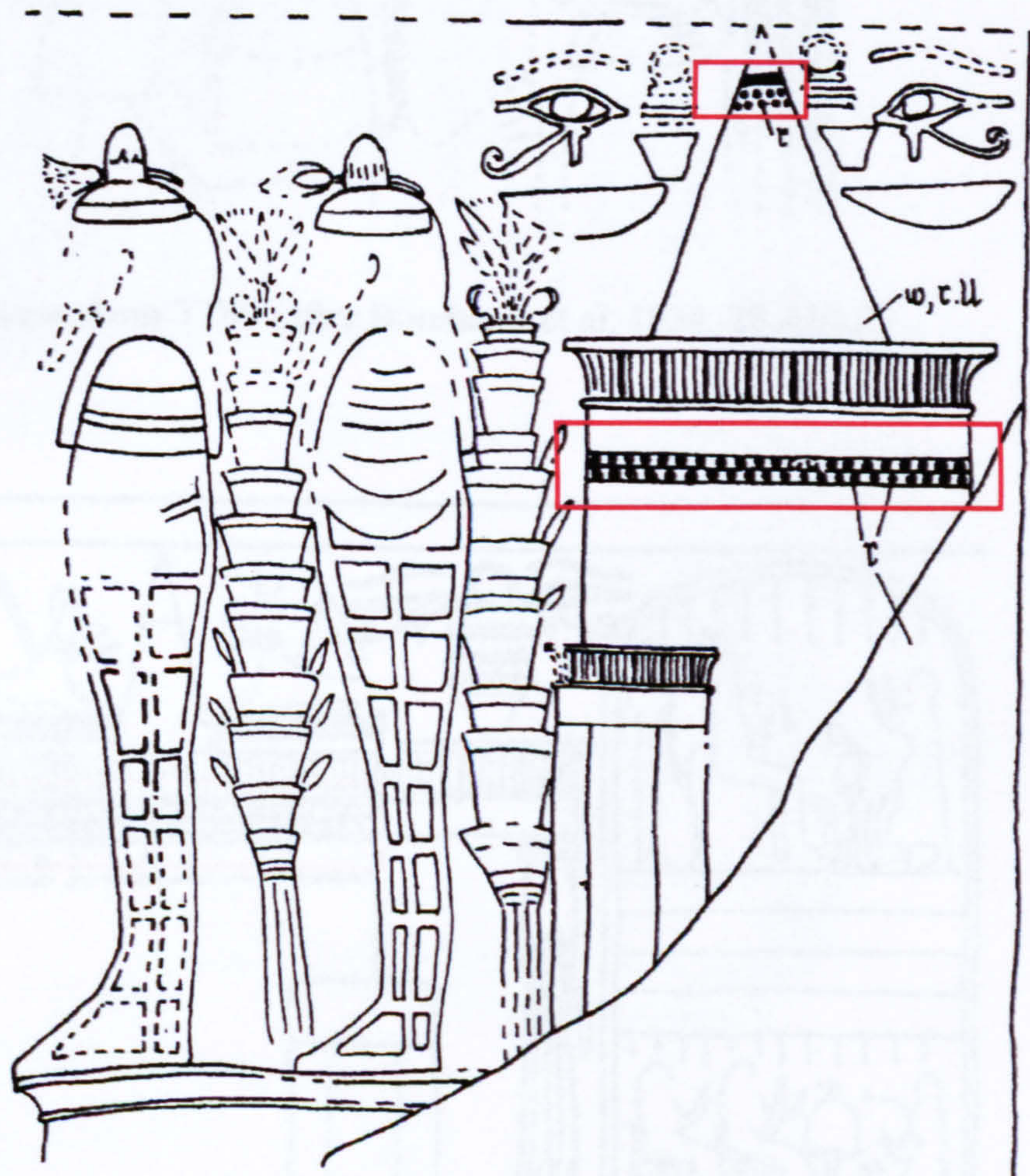


Figure 4 – Scene from TT159 (after Borchardt et al, 1934, 28 Abb.1)

As further support for this argument they pointed to Theban tomb scenes which showed the frontage of the tombs themselves and illustrated clusters of brown/red disks in frieze-bands above the entrance which could most obviously be interpreted as rows of cones ((Borchardt et al, 1934, 28). The illustrative evidence they used is reproduced below in figures 4-10.

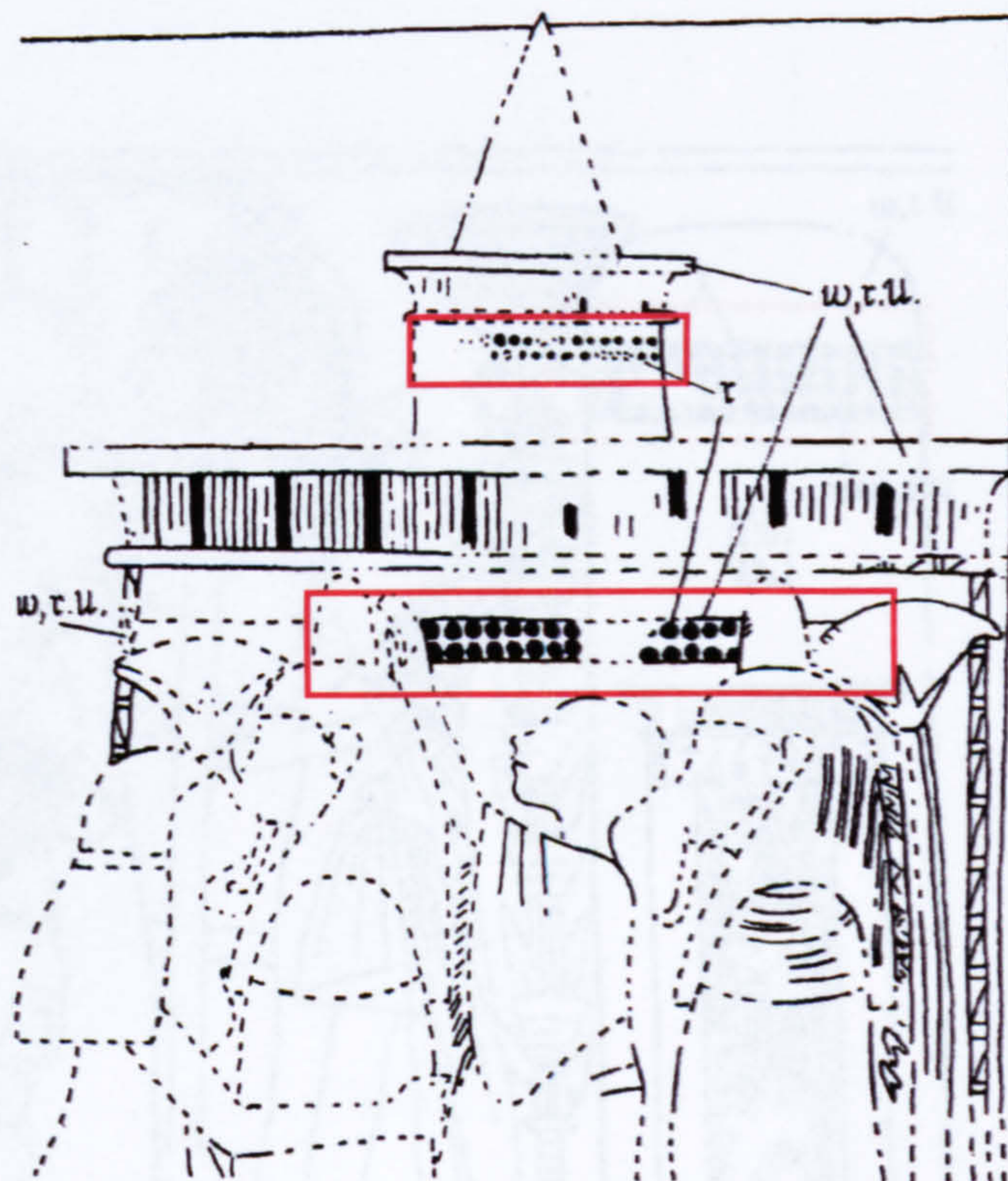


Figure 5 – Scene from TT49 (after Borchardt et al, 1934, 28 Abb.2)

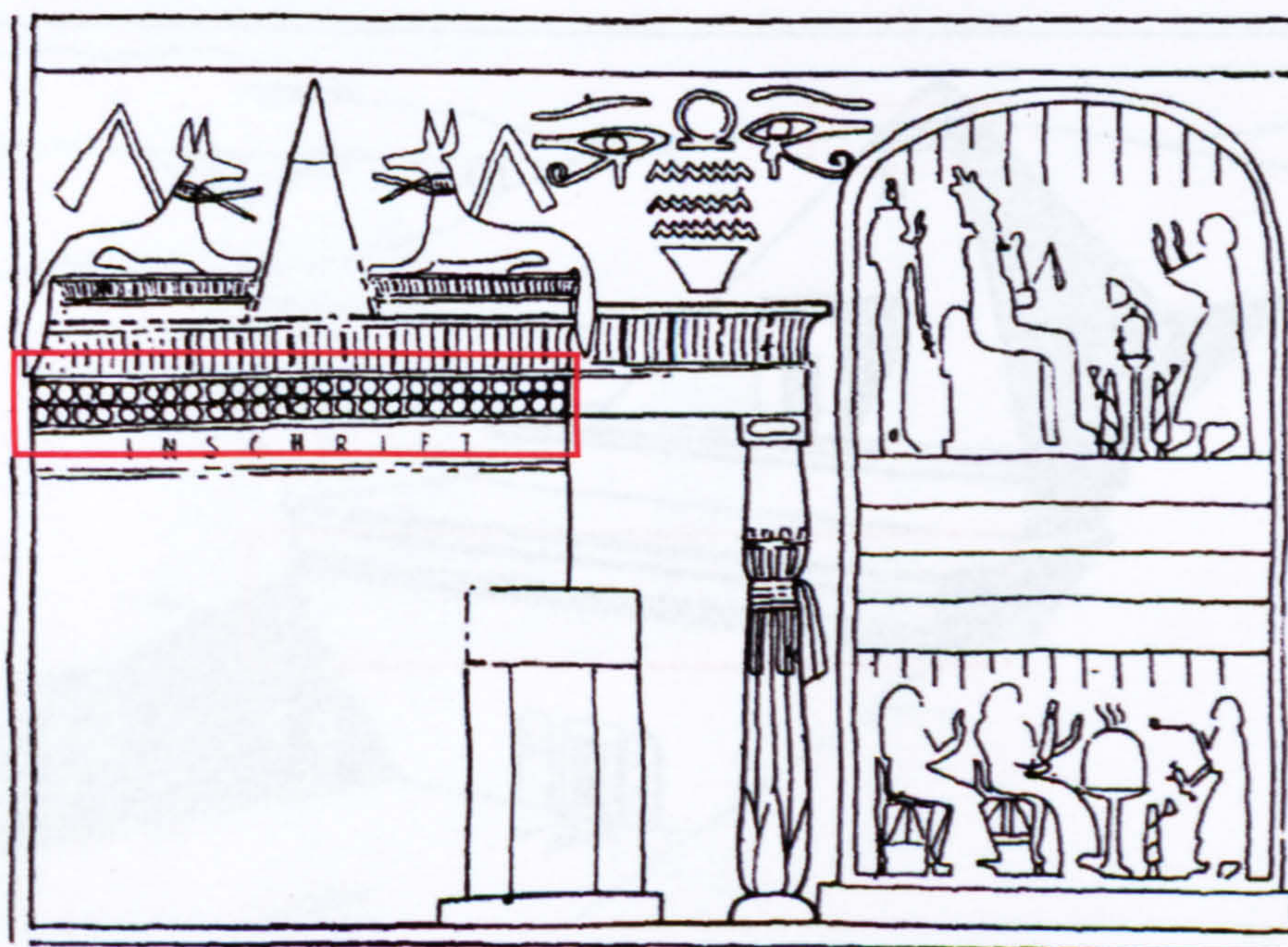


Figure 6 – Scene from TT178 (after Borchardt et al, 1934, 28 Abb.3)

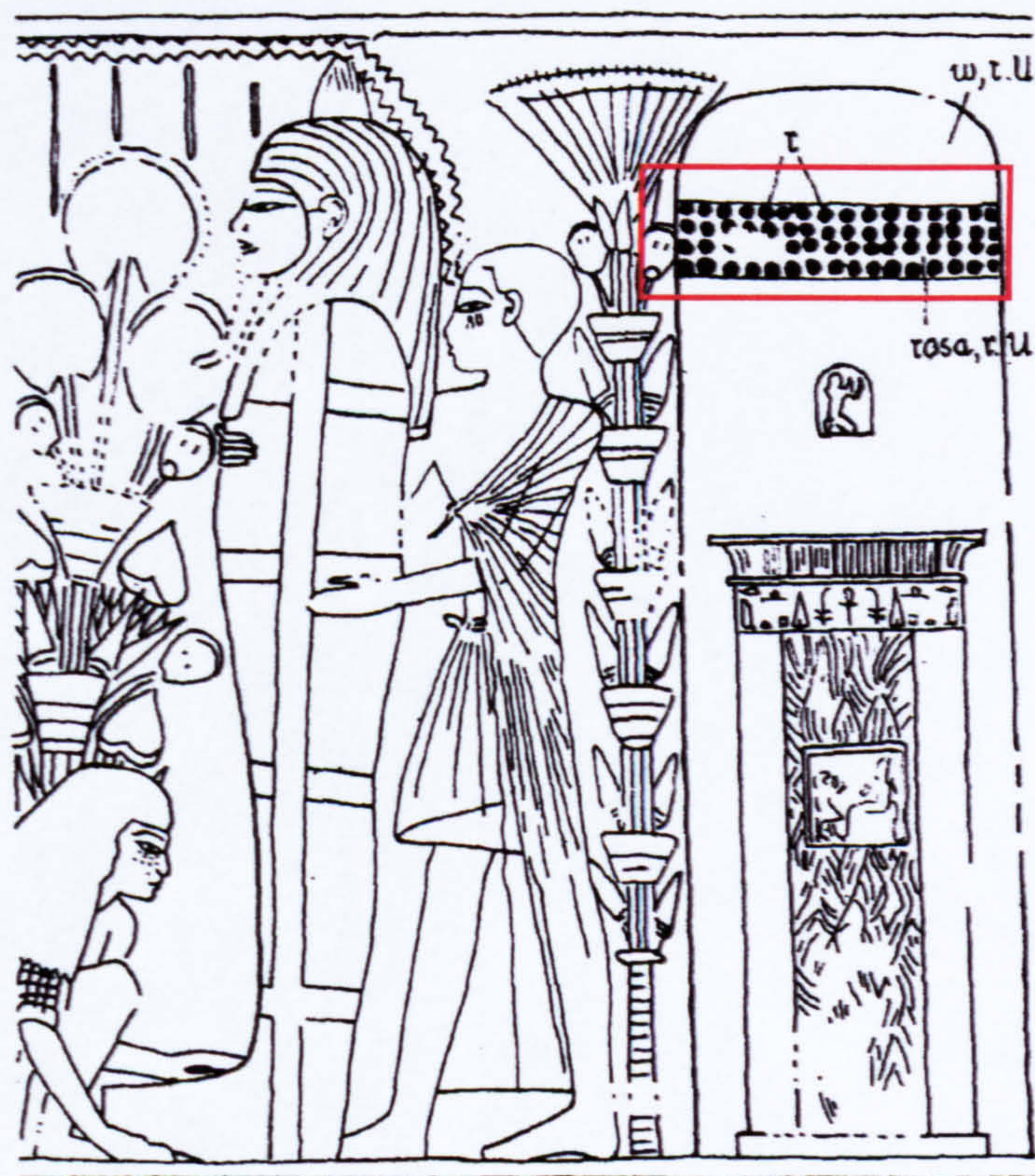


Figure 7 – Scene from TT181 (after Borchardt et al, 1934, 28 Abb.4)

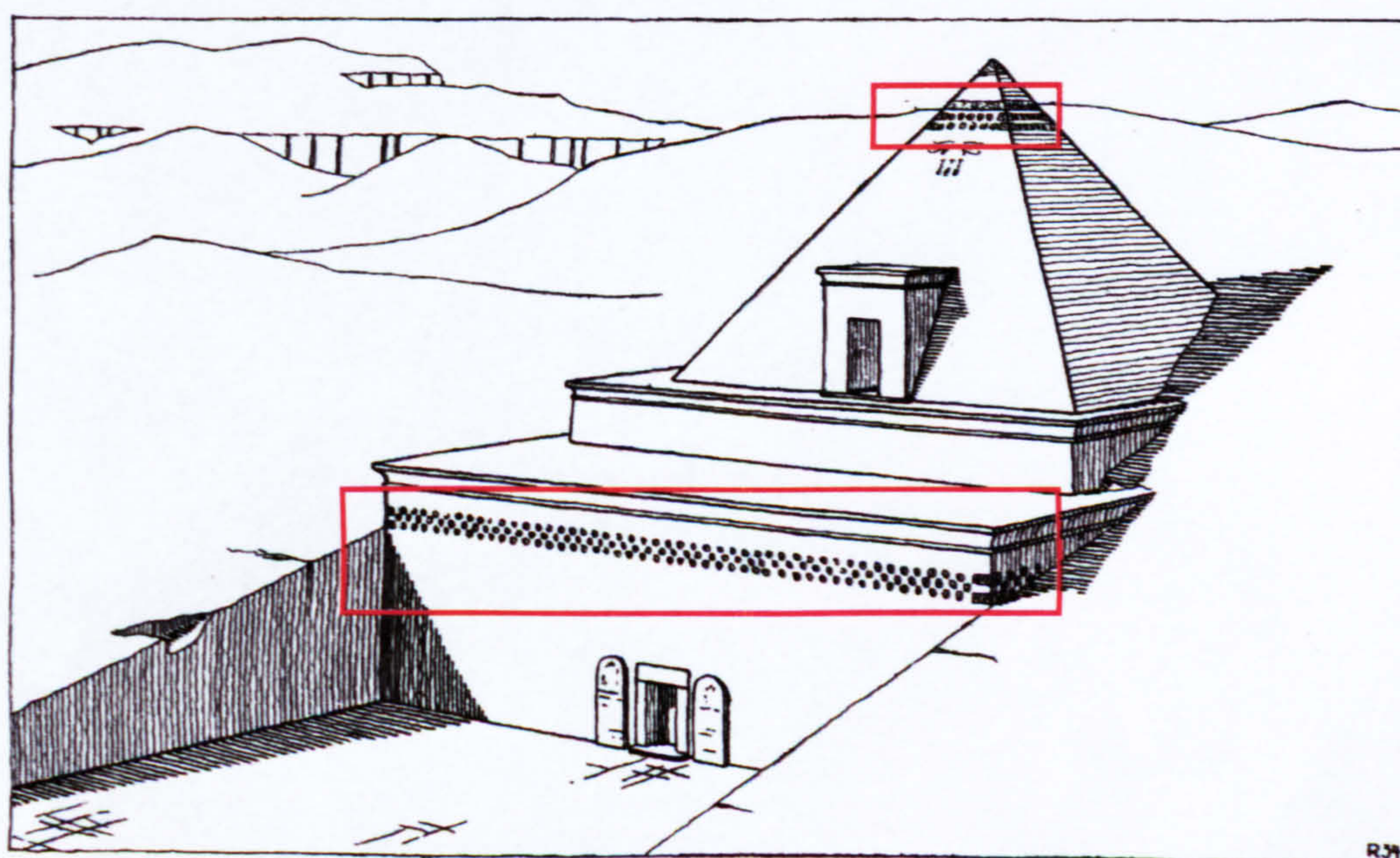


Figure 8 – Reconstruction of TT49 (after Borchardt et al, 1934, 29 Abb.5)

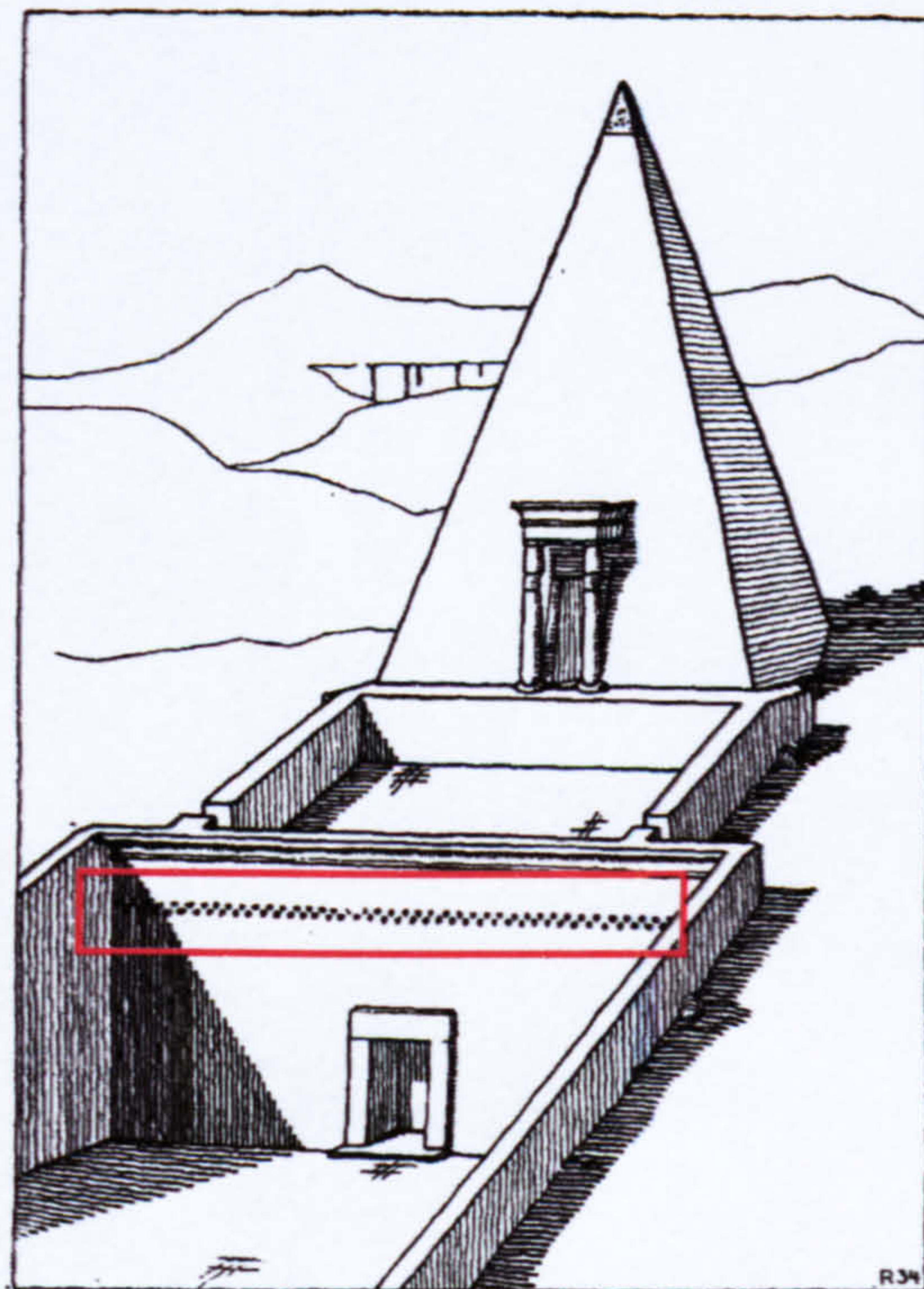


Figure 9 – Reconstruction of TT288/9 (after Borchardt et al, 1934, 29 Abb.6)

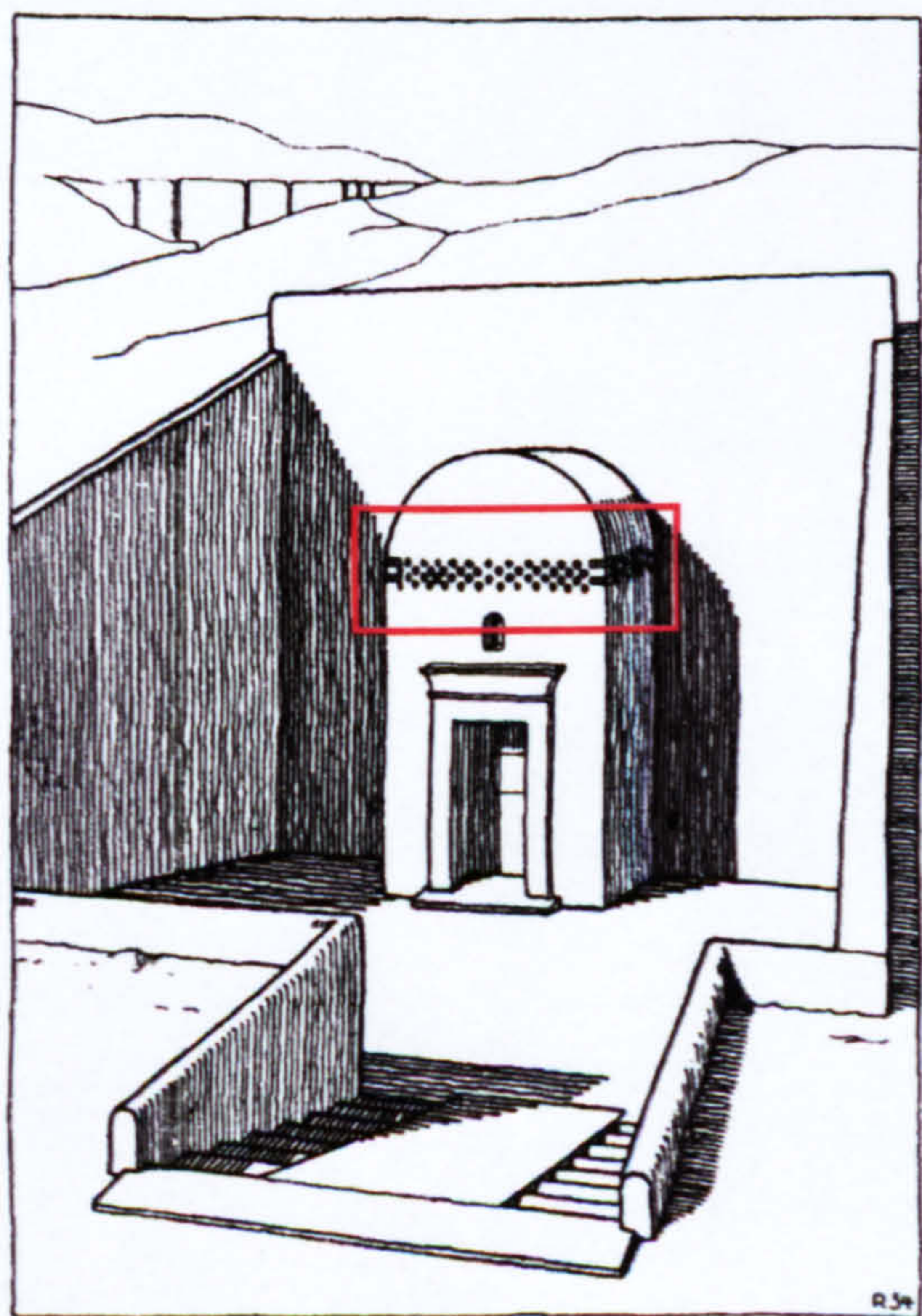


Figure 10 – Reconstruction of TT181 (after Borchardt et al, 1934, 29 Abb.7)

Since the work of Borchardt and his colleagues it has become generally accepted that funerary cones have an architectural role. However, it should be noted that although the architectural use of cones has been proved beyond reasonable doubt, it does not necessarily follow that this architectural use was the only way that cones could be used. There is a further factor to be considered. The tomb-scenes (with owners, dates and location) used by Borchardt and his colleagues are as follows:-

TT49	Neferhotep	Dynasty 18 (post-Amarna)
TT157	Nebwenenef	Ramesses II
TT159	Raia	Dynasty 19
TT178	Neferrenpet	Ramesses II
TT181	Nebamun	Dynasty 18 (Amenhotep III-IV)
TT288/9	Setjau	Ramesses II Dra Abu el-Naga

It is noticeable that illustrations of tombs with cone friezes only seem to appear from late Dynasty 18 and in the Ramesside period. Although this is probably a product of illustrations of the external appearance of tombs only becoming popular at this period, it is nevertheless important to be aware of the limitations of this illustrative evidence

### The Davies-Macadam Corpus

The single most useful publication in the study of funerary cones is the Corpus produced by Davies and Macadam (1957). This work came about from the collection of funerary cones by Norman de Garis Davies when he was living in Gurnah village, working as an epigrapher in Theban private tombs. It was his plan to publish these cones in facsimile and supersede Daressy's corpus both in scale (he had collected more types – 611 - than Daressy) and in accuracy (Daressy's corpus had hand-copies only). Davies died before this work was completed and his collection and papers were given to the Griffith Institute where they were sorted by Battiscombe Gunn (Davies & Macadam 1957, v). The task of working on this material was later given to Laming Macadam. The problem which faced Macadam was the sheer scale of the task. In order to produce the commentaries on the cones was a huge undertaking, something which every scholar working on these cones has discovered, because as Macadam says, "Almost every text offers in itself a small line of research" (Davies & Macadam 1957, v). Macadam therefore made the decision to publish the facsimile copies of the cone texts so that they would be available to scholars, with the hope that he would complete the companion commentary volume (Davies & Macadam 1957, x). Sadly this volume was incomplete at Macadam's death in 1997.

However, Macadam makes a number of comments in the Preface to the Plate volume, based on the notes compiled by Davies. In particular he dismissed the

idea that there was any important distinction between circular and square stamps (Davies & Macadam 1957, vii); he noted that the counting of distinct lines of text is not always easy and so created a class of “awkward” texts (Corpus numbers 351-374 – Davies and Macadam 1957, viii); he suggested that the cones containing *dwꜣ rꜥ* texts, especially when qualified by reference to the sun’s rising or setting, might indicate a particular architectural setting for that cone (Davies & Macadam 1957, ix). He also considered the question of what should properly be included in this class of object, especially the issue of stamped bricks. He came to the conclusion that (*contra* Borchardt et al) not all stamped bricks should be included within the corpus, presumably because they were distinct enough a class of object that the fact of them being stamped did not make them similar enough to be included together (Davies & Macadam 1957, ix-x).

Following the publication of the Davies and Macadam Corpus Heyler, who had been working on the funerary cones in Strasbourg, produced an article which effectively published that collection while making a number of observations on Davies and Macadam’s work (Heyler 1959), none of which added to any obvious way to the debate on the role and function of funerary cones.

More recently careful work in excavating in the Theban cemeteries has produced additional results which are helpful in developing hypotheses

regarding funerary cones (see below Chapter 3) while developments of old theories continue to be made, including Eggebrecht's championing (Eggebrecht 1977, 858-9) of the funerary cone as having a predominant role as a solar symbol (on this see Chapter 5, below).

However, one of the most important attempts to explain the use of funerary cones and, more particularly, to use them to solve an archaeological problem, is that developed by Manniche (1998). This attempt will now be discussed in more detail in Chapter 2.



## CHAPTER 2

### FUNERARY CONES AND THE THEORY OF THEBAN 'LOST TOMBS'

#### Funerary Cones and 'Lost Tombs

One of the most important attempts to use the data from the cones to answer an archaeological problem has been the work carried out by Manniche. The publication of this work (Manniche 1988) contains a general description of the author's opinion of the nature and function of funerary cones (Manniche 1988, 3-9) as the background for the real purpose of the study – the use of cones as an aid in identifying 'lost tombs'. Funerary cones are one of the sources of evidence used by Manniche in her attempt to assess how many private tombs of the New Kingdom at Thebes are still to be located, based on material which comes from these tombs and has survived in the archaeological record. Other types of this evidence include the accounts of now-lost tombs by early travellers or fragments of decorated wall-plaster from identifiable but similarly-lost sources of origin. However, it is only the funerary cones which offer the possibility of identifying (at least in theory) literally hundreds of New Kingdom private tombs whose location is now not known.

It is perhaps more correct to say that, given the nature of the evidence, Manniche is attempting to find elite tombs, that is to say tombs which contain

a substantial number of attributes - architectural, epigraphic or in terms of their contents - which make their presence very evident and the identity of their owner usually clear. This is one way of describing the classic 'Theban Tomb' as usually referred to in the literature; another definition would be a tomb whose attributes would find it a place within the *Topographical Bibliography*.

Put simply, Manniche's argument is that funerary cones derive from Theban tombs. The existence of a funerary cone belonging to any given individual is an indication of that individual also owning a Theban tomb. If one puts together known examples of funerary cones with known Theban tombs, the residue of cones must come from tombs that are now 'lost'.

Manniche carried out this process using the dated tombs contained in the *Topographical Bibliography* volume of private tombs in the Theban necropolis (Porter & Moss 1960) which represented the 'canon' of known elite tombs in the private cemeteries of Western Thebes at the date of publication, supplemented by three unpublished Theban tombs (Manniche 1988, 12) making a total of 406 'usable' tombs. The table linking known Theban tombs to the cones published by Daressy and Davies & Macadam (Manniche 1988, 10-11, Table I) has been used as one source of material for the database in this thesis. Manniche's (1988, 12, Table III) summary of this information divides the 79 tombs so identified into location and period (e.g. 70 tombs are of

Dynasty 18, 7 are Ramesside and 2 generalised 'New Kingdom'). The preponderance of Dynasty 18 cone-linked tombs compared to Ramesside examples is notable. Perhaps as striking a figure is the low proportion of known cone-linked tombs (79 of 406 is less than 16%). But the number of cones without tombs is similarly large. Manniche's summation of the situation, and the core of her method, is:-

*The number of tombs without cones is 327. The amount of cones without tombs is more than 400, i.e. about as many as there are known New Kingdom tombs in the necropolis. (Manniche 1988, 9)*

There are further assumptions suggested by Manniche (1988, 9): that "each cone represents a tomb" or at least (leaving aside female cones on male tombs) that "each male cone owner possessed a tomb". If these assumptions are valid then a number of possibilities flow from them, including:-

- 1) The approximate similarity in number of cone-less tombs and tomb-less cones might suggest that the two sets can be put together. However the linking of cones with tombs is problematic, since the names and titles which are the heart of the 'identity' of both cones and tombs are dissimilar enough to make such linkages difficult if not impossible.

- 2) That the tomb-less cones represent tombs which are now lost. This would mean that there are in the order of 400 'missing' elite tombs of the New Kingdom (particularly of Dynasty 18) in the Theban necropolis.
- 3) If 2) is the case (or at least if 1) is incorrect, as would seem likely) then the large proportion (84%) of Theban New Kingdom tombs without identifiable cones need to be explained.

### Coneless Tombs?

There is an obvious problem to Manniche's thesis, which no one seems to have pointed out. While it might be easily argued that there are reasons for the existence of cones without them having to come from particular tombs, I believe it can also be argued that it is by no means the case that we can assume that all major elite New Kingdom tombs at Thebes would have had cones as part of their funerary furniture.

Overleaf is a table showing a selection of Theban tombs which have no known funerary cone associated with them or their owner, covering a range from early Dynasty 18 to the Ramesside period. Some of these might be a result of 'lost' cones which once existed, but it is extremely unlikely that the tomb of Rekhmire (TT100), the largest private tomb in the Theban cemeteries and with a very wide façade, would have lost all its cones had they ever existed.

### Kampp and additions to the canon of Theban Tombs

In 1996 Friederike Kampp published his monumental study of private tombs at Thebes (Kampp 1996). This work assembled all the then-known information on private tombs of the New Kingdom on the West Bank at Thebes, particularly regarding their architectural form. Kampp's work attempted to use the different attributes of architectural design of these tombs as (among other things) a dating criterion. This information, combined with the epigraphic material contained in Porter & Moss (1960) has been an important source for the dating attribute of the database of this thesis.

Kampp provides a brief description of funerary cones, with a stress on their possible use as an architectural feature (as is evident in his preferred term "Friesziegel" – Kampp 1998, 66-68). More importantly, particularly with regard to the development of Manniche's theories regarding missing tombs and cone ownership, is Kampp's addition of 551 tombs to the canon of known private tombs in the New Kingdom cemeteries at Western Thebes. These 'new' tombs are the result of constant and extensive exploration of the Theban necropolis in the 36 years following the publication of the relevant *Topographical Bibliography* volume. The general character of these additions to the Theban tomb canon is that they tend, perhaps unsurprisingly, to be smaller and less architecturally impressive than the long-known tombs of most of the earlier canon.

From the dating tables produced by Kampp for all the Theban tombs analysed by him (Kampp 1996, 135-138 and 144-149) the 'new' tombs can be broken down into chronological categories. Some of these categories are the chronological 'bands' used in the database, while others are rather more vague, such as those allowing the identification of a tomb to the Ramesside period in general, but without any specific allocation to Dynasty, let alone reign. The summary of Kampp's chronological analysis for his 'new' tombs (referred to henceforth as K. tombs), with comparative numbers of existing canon 'TT' tombs in brackets is as follows: -

The first point to note is that the proportions of K tombs to TT tombs is approximately equal across the chronological bands. This is especially the case where reasonably close dating within a narrow band is possible, and in the cumulative totals for Dynasty 18 and the Ramesside period. This is to say that no part of the New Kingdom has experienced a sudden proportional increase in known tombs with the addition of the K group.



However, it is very noticeable indeed that there is a major discrepancy between the K and the TT series when tombs which are less easy to date specifically are considered. This is apparent in the comparison of non-specific Ramesside tombs (84 in the K series, 29 in the TT series), non-specific New Kingdom (94 in the K series, 6 in the TT series) and, most obviously in the undatable series (189 in the K series, 1 in the TT series). In the case of the latter category this can be partially explained by the early selection of 'official' Theban tombs by the Antiquities Service, and the incorporation within the *Topographical Bibliography* based on size of tomb and the (usually related) presence of text/decoration within the tomb.

But this also serves to make an important point; the additional K series tombs are, overwhelmingly, smaller, architecturally simpler, and less well decorated (if at all) than the TT series. Kampp (1996, 139) has been able to identify a possible owner for only 17 of them (or 18 if the re-use of one of them is included), of which 15 are Dynasty 18 (pre-Amarna) in date. The K series does not represent the hundreds of 'lost tombs' postulated by Manniche on the basis of tomb-less cones, or at least cannot be proved to be so given the anonymous character of most of the K series. In fact Kampp (1996, 67) is only able to link 7 of the K series tombs to known cone types, all of which are from Dynasty 18. This reinforces the fact that the K series does nothing to redress the heavy balance of the presence of funerary cones in Dynasty 18 when compared to Ramesside tombs.

The general impression given by the K series is that they are, for the most part, smaller and less impressive versions of the more impressive, well-known contemporary tombs in the Theban necropolis. It therefore appears very unlikely that a major group of tombs, corresponding to the tombless cones, is yet to be discovered. There is, of course, another possibility; that these smaller, largely undecorated and anonymous tombs were 'labelled' by the very presence of the cheap and easily produced funerary cones. But if this is the case then exactly how this labelling was achieved needs to be explained – did the smaller tombs which primarily make up the K series have superstructures in which the cones were fixed, and which are now lost? That is certainly a possibility, given there is no architecturally-fixed funerary cones have survived intact even on large New Kingdom tombs, but it seems unlikely. This discrepancy also raises once again questions associated with the function of funerary cones - are funerary cones primarily associated with the burial of the cone-owner and, if so, where might these burials be? If the funerary cones are not primarily associated with the burials of cone-owners then in what context are they used, given that the texts they bear are clearly funerary in a general sense?

There is possibly another way of looking at this problem. Rather than thinking of lost 'tombs' (in the sense of elite rock-cut and decorated tomb chapels) it might be better to think about burials. We have already seen, in Mond and Emery's account of their excavations around the tomb of Ramose, that a large

elite tomb and the courtyard in front of it can contain a series of shafts for individual burials. These burials might be later and intrusive, or that might be contemporary or near-contemporary of members of the family of the large tomb who have no tomb (i.e. tomb chapel) of their own and are buried within the 'precincts' of the tomb chapel of their family member. How are these minor family members to be marked?

These factors might affect funerary cone placement in a number of ways:

- i A minor family member is allowed to have a small number their cones affixed to the façade of the major 'family' tomb-chapel. It might even be that several family members (perhaps otherwise buried anonymously in the courtyard of the tomb, or even elsewhere) could be attested in this way.
- ii It might be possible to suggest (with no supporting evidence whatsoever) that small mud brick superstructures over the individual shafts could contain funerary cones.
- iii The evidence produced by Mond and Emery in the case of the tomb of Ramose strongly suggests that large Dynasty 18 tomb chapels could be usurped during the Ramesside Period, especially by the addition of mud-brick porticos and overbuildings (of the type discussed by Borchardt et al) to existing Dynasty 18 structures. The cheap and easy construction of these

elements, and their 'labelling' by the large scale use of funerary cones, would be a relative simple way of effectively 'rebranding' the tomb.

However, in all these scenarios the disintegration of either original Dynasty 18 or later Ramesside mudbrick additions through natural erosion would then leave a situation where both Dynasty 18 and Ramesside cones themselves would survive in the debris around Dynasty 18 tombs. With the loss of the principal feature which associated the tomb with Ramesside ownership, this might explain at least some of the undated examples of cones which one might suspect as being Ramesside. To turn Manniche's theory on its head; cones without tombs do, in part, represent 'missing' tombs, but only missing in the sense that they are a now-unidentifiable re-use of otherwise well-known Dynasty 18 structures.

## CHAPTER 3

### A NOTE ON INENI AND THE ORIGIN OF NEW KINGDOM FUNERARY CONES

During the past thirty years, and continuing today, there has been much archaeological work in the Theban necropolis. Most of this work is detailed and careful, and collects much more information than was done in the past. The work of the many archaeologists who excavate in Western Thebes is relevant to this thesis in two major ways. Firstly it adds to our number of funerary cones, although as time goes on the discovery of new types of cone becomes rarer and rarer (I have only been able to find 14 new types of funerary cone published since the Davies and Macadam Corpus). Perhaps more importantly it adds to our understanding of the context (or, rather, different contexts) in which funerary cones occur. In this way the work of Mond and Emery is continued.

A good example illustrates the way in which recent work and careful study has helped to develop our understanding of developments in the use of funerary cones as part of the tomb complex as a whole, the tomb of Ineni (TT81).

Ineni was one of the most significant individuals in the development of the monumental culture of the early 18<sup>th</sup> Dynasty. In his autobiography (Urk. IV,

53) he claims responsibility for both the origination of the Valley of the Kings as a place for royal burial and the development of central Karnak. He was also probably responsible for the building of the mortuary temple of Tuthmosis I (Gessler-Löhr 1983, 87). He was closely connected by family ties to the highest ranks of the Theban administration. Dziobek (1987, 69) believes there is strong evidence that his sister was the wife of the contemporary Vizier Ahmose/Aamethu, whose son, User, followed his father as vizier in Year 5 of Hatshepsut. It is also possible that he was responsible for the development of the distinctive nature of private tombs at Thebes early in the 18<sup>th</sup> Dynasty.

In an important article Dziobek (1987) argued convincingly for a three-stage process in the development of the typical 'T'-shaped Theban private tomb, and that this process could be seen most clearly at the tomb of Ineni (TT81). These three stages are as follows:-

**Stage 1** is the remodelling of existing Middle Kingdom 'saff' tombs by officials of the early 18<sup>th</sup> Dynasty. This remodelling including the walling up of the intercolumnar spaces of the typical 'saff' tomb façade with mud-brick to produce a wide-fronted niched façade combining rock-cut columns and mud-brick niches. These mud-brick intercolumnations later disappeared through natural processes so that the tombs appear today to be open-columned. Some of these tombs were unfinished Middle Kingdom tombs abandoned very early in the 12<sup>th</sup> Dynasty when the court cemetery shifted north to Lisht. (Dziobek

1987, 76). Tombs in this group include those of Ineni himself (TT 81) – who Dziobek would like to believe is the initiator of this architectural innovation, though he does not like to say so (Dziobek 1987, 79) and also those of the Vizier Aamethu (TT 83) and the high Priest of Amen, Hepusonb (TT 67).

**Stage 2** consists of tombs built not by remodelling older tombs, but by cutting new tombs into the rock of the Theban cliffs. An interesting feature in these new tombs is that, although it meant much more work for the quarrymen, the design retained the niched façade which had been produced out of necessity in the Stage 1 tombs. The most obvious examples in this group include those of Senenmut (TT 71 and TT 353). Senmen, Senenmut's brother has a variant (TT 252) whereby his tomb has a plain façade, but windows on either side of the door.

**Stage 3** tombs show that the transverse (or 'broad') hall has become completely enclosed by the façade, forming the typical pattern for Theban tomb design until the Amarna Period.

However, Dziobek does not attempt to explain how funerary cones might be part of this process. In his fuller publication of the tomb (Dziobek 1992) he clearly lists the known examples of funerary cones found around the entrance to the tomb of Ineni, a total of 153 including 97 previously found by Mond plus 55 found by the German Mission.

As far as the identification of funerary cones with the tomb of Ineni is concerned it seem likely that while Corpus numbers 480 and 481 were associated with the owner of TT81, There is no specific reason to connect Corpus 424-426 with this Ineni (Dziobek 1992, 114).

Interestingly Dziobek quotes a personal communication from Macadam saying “Davies saw an example Cairo 56208 B ‘Same text but incised and reversed and a smaller stamp.’ He thought that some of the examples assigned to cone 480 might in fact be cone 481.” (Dziobek 1992, 114).

I would like to suggest another possibility. In the case where there are large numbers of left facing stamps and only one example of a right facing stamp, which is ‘incised’ rather than showing relief carving, it seems more likely that this single stamp is in fact a matrix for stamping other cones. Although a limestone matrix is known (Corpus 219) and Davies thought that matrices were made of wood, there is no reason why a properly fired ceramic matrix (which is, after all, very easy and cheap to make) could not be used to stamp soft wet clay.

A further point of interest is the way in which Dziobek sees Ineni as developing the standard form of Theban Dynasty 18 tomb by adapting existing Middle Kingdom tombs. I would like to suggest that Ineni (or his



contemporaries) may also have begun the use of inscribed funerary cones by taking an aspect of Middle Kingdom tomb design (anepigraphic cones of the type excavated by Winlock) and adapted them for their own use, chiefly by the addition of identifying texts. This would seem in keeping with the general tendency of adopting and adapting existing Middle Kingdom features in very early Dynasty 18 tombs.

Dziobek states that a conceptual difference between the Middle Kingdom and New Kingdom tombs at Thebes is that in the Middle Kingdom tomb-owners wished for an impressive façade, whereas in Dynasty 18 people were interested in the decorated cult rooms behind and that the room created in the transverse hall behind the façade was what mattered as a “welcome chance to gain space for decoration and mortuary cult” (Dziobek 1987, 78). Nevertheless the continued use of wide-façade tombs in the rest of Dynasty 18 shows that there was clearly an interest in external display and, it seems likely, cones were part of this display. But this display which was not now simply an impressive (house-like?) façade with ceramic cones copying roofing poles, but was more specifically oriented toward the mortuary cult.

Unfortunately the state of preservation of TT81, like all tombs now to be seen in the Theban necropolis, does not allow us to reconstruct exactly how Ineni used them.

## CHAPTER 4

### DESCRIPTION OF THE DATABASE

One problem in using the information from the funerary cones is the sheer number of cones and therefore the very substantial amount of information to be analysed. In order to be able to manipulate this large dataset I designed a database using the Microsoft Access software.

There were two major aims in constructing this database. The first was that it would contain the primary information which constituted a basic record for the cones. The second aim would be that it would also be used to note extracted information which would be used in analysing the particular aspects of the cones which I chose to study.

The basic information was drawn from two sources. First was the published record of funerary cones, for which the major source was the Davies/Macadam corpus, supplemented by later publications of cones not contained in the Davies /Macadam corpus by individual scholars. Because the Davies/Macadam corpus is so large and well-established I followed the Davies/Macadam numbering for my database entries 1-611, and added 'new' cones sequentially after that.

The basic information consists of a drawing of the face of the cone. Most of these come from the Davies/Macadam corpus, and in the database the Davies/Macadam number (which appears under each drawing in the published corpus) has been retained

as a check on accuracy. Other aspects of primary information include the name of the cone-owner and their listed titles (which there extracts all the published information in the Davies/Macadam corpus), a concordance with Daressy's corpus, the Theban tomb associated with the cone-owner (where known).

Secondary information which has been extracted from the cones, or leads from that information, has been selected to try to answer a number of questions. Aspects of the text on the face of the cone have been extracted. These consist of fairly simple information concerning their design – shape (circular, oval or rectangular), number of text lines (roughly corresponding to length of text), whether those text lines are divided by dividing lines, orientation of text (i.e. vertical columns or horizontal lines), direction of text (left-facing, right-facing, or centrally balanced)

Another set of secondary information concerns the content of the text itself. I have chosen to focus on a few important aspects. The first of these concerns what might be called the religious orientation of the cones. As mentioned in the introduction several aspects of the cones have suggested to some scholars that cones are primarily associated with a solar afterlife. I therefore decided to investigate how common solar associations were within the text of the cones or to what extent Osirian associations were more or less important.

These two major areas of enquiry – text design and funerary associations – can be examined very easily by the database to produce absolute and proportional figures for these attributes. This type of information might not in itself be particularly useful, but I hoped, by cross-referencing this data to see whether design aspects of the cones

tended to work together (e.g. are text-heavy cones more likely to be set out in horizontal registers than cones with shorter texts?). These results are potentially more interesting in that they might give us an insight into design and working techniques of the cone-designer and the reasons for choices they might make in cone design.

## DATING

One of the tasks I wanted to attempt was to look at well-dated examples of funerary cones and then see whether it was possible to detect chronologically significant criteria which would allow to her funerary cones to be dated. The problem is to produce enough well-dated examples to make the typology sound and applicable to associate-less examples. The 'Dating' section of the database is the most problematic. It has been derived primarily from dating information connected with tombs from which known examples of cones come. It is very difficult to assign specific dates to most of the tombs within the Theban necropolis. It is fairly easy to discriminate between 18<sup>th</sup> Dynasty and Ramesside tombs on the basis of general style in both architecture and decoration, but beyond that, unless specific kings are mentioned close dating is difficult. On the cones themselves, there are few criteria which are helpful for dating. The information comes in two forms.

- 1) Direct. The information on the cones leads directly to specific reigns (e.g. Senenmut for the reigning Hatshepsut). These are rare. More often the royal reference is to an individual serving the cult of a king – these give a terminus post quem of uncertain length for that king's reign.
- 2) Indirect. The information on the cone is sufficient to link the cone to an individual who is better known from other sets of data, most often a specific

Theban tomb which may or may not contain enough information to make a dating possible.

If we turn to the dating of Theban tombs the consideration of various criteria have led to the estimation of dates for particular tombs or groups of tombs, either through the study of a specific tomb and its owner (ref.) or through the consideration of a wide range of data which allows the production of comparative dates.

The two most important compendium sources for the dating of Theban tombs are Porter and Moss (1960), which largely drew on the individual studies used in compiling the Topographical Bibliography at the time of its production, and Kampp, who uses a variety of criteria to date all the Porter and Moss (TT) tombs, plus an additional 551 are either uninscribed (and therefore of no interest to Porter & Moss) or have been discovered subsequent to Porter and Moss. The range of dates produced by Kampp (for a summary see his dates see Kampp 1996, 144-149) are in most cases minor revisions or confirmations of the Porter and Moss dates. Unless otherwise stated it is Kampp who is the source for the dating of an individual cone, where that cone has been associated with a Theban tomb, and the relevant entry in Kampp should be consulted for the dating criteria.

The precision which can be applied to dating varies from period to period. Interestingly, the level of detail for dating Theban tombs is most precise at the period where most cones are being produced – Dynasty 18 rather than the Ramesside period. Perhaps this is part of a general tendency for more detailed self-presentation through

titles and linkage to the ruling king which is notable for Dynasty 18 rather than the Ramesside period.

In order to assist analysis, the dates are presented by a series of numerical 'bands'. This is partly to reflect the uncertainty in precision in some of these dates, and partly to assist in the manipulation of the data within the database. The 'bands' are :-

**NUMBERS OF CONES**

This was not a critical aspect of my study, but those cones I have 'collected' are noted here as part of the potential expansion of the database.

There is a very important aspect to this, that it is flexible and capable of being added to in the future. This can be done in one of three ways; by adding previously unknown cone types to the dataset, by adding individual examples of cones to the list of known examples, and by manipulating the database to extract information of interest to different scholars. In the last case it would be possible to sub-divide and individually list the titles contained within the database so that the cones could be an important source for prosopographical study of individuals and office-holders in New Kingdom Thebes.

**FAMILY**

I was also interested in the extent to which other members of the cone-owners family were mentioned on his cone, or whether there were 'associated' cones belonging to members of the cone/tombowners family. I was particularly interested in the extent that women owned cones, and the ways in which women were referred to

## CHAPTER 5

### SELECTIVE ATTRIBUTE ANALYSIS USING THE DATABASE

One advantage of using a computerised database is the way in which it can be used to manipulate large quantities of data. The design of a database and the inputting of the raw data can be a very time-consuming process but, once it has been properly constructed, it can easily be added to and used in a remarkably large number of ways.

The Funerary Cone Database which I have constructed is a resource which can be added to. It is by no means complete because a work like this can never be 'complete' – there is always material to be added from museums contributing data or through new excavations. I plan to publish the Funerary Cone Database as an on-line resource for others scholars to add to. But the fact that the Database does not contain every example of every type of funerary cone is not important at this stage. I have tried to collect all the different types of funerary cone, and the analytical work I have carried out using the Database is based on cone types rather than numbers of examples for each type. It is possible, in the future when the Database has acquired even more specific examples for the various types, that analysis based on numbers of examples per type can be systematically carried out. Such types of analysis might

include a more obvious linkage of what the numbers of individual cones per type might say about their use – do large numbers imply architectural use in the tomb of the cone owner while smaller numbers imply other possibilities?

As described in the previous section the printed Database as presented in this thesis contains two types of information; basic primary information and specifically chosen attributes. These attributes were chosen so that they could be analysed in order to find out whether they produced significant results which might aid our understanding of the role and function of funerary cones. It should be noted that the relatively limited proportion of well-dated cones means that chronological results obtained from these analyses should perhaps be regarded with some caution.

These attributes which I have analysed are tabulated and discussed below.

### THE FORM OF THE CONE STAMP

I decided to see whether there was any significance in the form of the cone stamp and the way in which the text on the stamp was laid out. I was interested in the shape of the stamp itself (circular, square/oblong or oval), whether the registers of text were separated by dividing lines or not, the number of registers of text, the orientation of the text (horizontal or vertical), and the direction in which the text faced.

I was also interested to see whether these factors had any chronological significance and whether these features appeared in particular periods. I decided to concentrate my analysis on New Kingdom cones, and only included later cones where the results were particularly significant.

### Stamp Shape

The shape of the stamp itself was cross-analysed with the date of the stamp and by the columns/registers of text it contains. This was done to see whether the shape of the stamp had a clear chronological development or whether it could be linked to more practical issues such as the number of columns and length of the text. The most obvious result is the overwhelming predominance of circular stamps when compared to square/oblong or oval stamps. This is perhaps not surprising since the circular stamp naturally lends itself to the circular face/base of a cone. However non-circular stamps do occur. Table 1

indicates that oval stamps are only used for short texts of 1-3 columns. Square/oblong stamps also tend to be used for shorter texts; only one example has a text longer than 4 columns, while circular cones can be used for anything up to 9 columns, although even on circular cones anything longer than 5 columns is rare.

Chronologically (Table 2) the numbers of dated cones are comparatively low, so it is dangerous to make very firm conclusions, but the rarity of square/oblong cones before period 06 (the reign of Amenhotep II) is very noticeable.

Dividing Lines

The information presented in Tables 3 and 4 strongly suggests that the presence or absence of dividing lines is dictated by design considerations rather than demonstrating any chronological significance.

The preference for texts to be read from left to right is very obvious, as is the general preference for vertical rather than horizontal registers of text. The small preference for vertical rather than horizontal registers for right-facing texts is unclear and may be related to a preference for vertical columns where matched right/left facing texts is concerned. Few cones can be matched in this way. It should be noted that there is no significant right-facing tendency for cones belonging to dependents of tomb-owners and all the code 99 (owned by women with no relationship mentioned) are left-facing.

Once again we have the problem of too few well-dated examples to come to any firm conclusions. However, it can be stated that there is a clear preference at all periods for a relationship with the wife to be stressed. This may well be because the tomb was, in many cases, a joint tomb for the husband and wife and the wife would need to be seen to be present on the funerary cones which mark the tomb.

### Osirian Associations

Here the picture is clear. There is a very strong association between many funerary cones and Osiris. The simplest methods (especially the form *im3hy/im3hw Wsir*) are most popular. The *m3<sup>c</sup> hrw* formulations, either alone or in combination disappear before the reign of Amenhotep III, and this might be seen as a move away from a very obvious Osirian connection of the funerary cones to one where solar associations are more common.

The table raises a number of interesting points:-

- i There is no significant concentration of types of solar association.
- ii Only 2 examples are datable – both to the end of Dynasty 18.
- iii There is a clear connection between solar associations and circular stamps. This might suggest that the (red) circular stamped end of the cone was seen as representing the sun's disc and the text of solar praise on the cone would be doubly appropriate.

On this evidence it would seem that a solar connection for these funerary cones is very likely. It might be argued that a solar purpose for the cones is unlikely given that they are not found at Amarna, nor at Deir el-Medina, and those with solar texts are few in number.

But this misses the real point and the most obvious conclusion of this thesis, which is that there is no one single use for funerary cones. They changed their emphasis during the New Kingdom to be used in different ways which suited the needs of different groups of Thebans at different times.
